Recent News

Maintenance Day: Monday 17th January had our energetic crew on site for the start of the new year, to unpack all of our equipment, carry out the necessary inspections and make sure all was in readiness for the sailing season. Yacht Faith was slipped at Royal Queensland Yacht Squadron to have the hull cleaned, the life jackets were checked and replacements carried out where necessary, the dinghies were rigged and tested to ensure all working parts were in order and the kitchen and store room were cleaned and prepared, ready for another year of action. Both the Support Boat and Faith were then subjected to a venture on the bay with a few passengers to ensure they were as sea-worthy as possible.



Cooling the Kitchen: The kitchen area and the under-building area generally has always been a hot-box in summer and regardless of how many small fans were placed around, it remained steamy. That situation has now been changed with the purchase of a huge electric fan that recycles the volume of air under the building in about 30 seconds. It is a great innovation for our dedicated kitchen ladies with the only caution being to set the fan on low speed only. Any higher speed setting and section becomes a wind tunnel clearing any dust and dirt from every crevice.



Cash Register: Another innovation this year was the acquisition of an electronic Cash Register, that is not just a means of calculating sales amounts but for also dispensing printed receipts for customers. That alone is a great time saving feature for our volunteers manning the Registration Desk.



PFD Trolley Wheels:



The mobile timber closet for holding most of our life jackets and lifting slings has been with us now for many years and given great service. It was originally donated by the Rotary Club of Wynnum and Manly who remain staunch supporters today. Relocating this heavy piece of equipment in and out of storage each sailing day requires serious energy so that it was suggested that fitting larger wheels would be of assistance. Brian V undertook the task of replacing the wheels which improved the mobility of the trolley.



More recently, Glenn R has developed a wire sling towing cable that allows the Golf Cart to be used as motive power for both PFD trollies and we are now in the process of trialling this method to ease the physical efforts required by our volunteers.

Nesting Plovers: Our Plover family have been active again this year with the parents now into their second batch of chicks. Both nests were made right in the centre of the grassed area where human activity is at its premium. To reduce the risk of interference between birds and people, it was necessary to place high viz bollards around the nest which worked very well for all parties.
